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Car crashes cost each **American \$1,035 per year**

The cost escalated to \$340 billion in 2019. according to a new NHTSA study.

hese costs are calculated for every American and totaled out to \$1,035 per person, whether involved in an accident or not.

Seeing the numbers involved, it's no wonder that body shops are so busy these days. There were more than 23 million vehicles damaged during this study's timeframe. The report also states that 36,500 people were killed and 4.5 million injured, as as a result. All signs that there's still a long way to go for road and vehicle safety.

Somewhat surprisingly, those not directly involved in crashes pay for about three-quarters of all crash costs through higher insurance premiums, taxes, and other hardto-calculate factors such as travel delays, increased fuel consumption, and environmental impacts. These costs totaled over \$261 billion.

Some say the current body shop business model is broken due to how much influence (or control) the insurance companies have over the entire process, from what a shop can charge for a headlight to replacement body panels. While the growing number of fatalities is worrisome, technology can make cars safer and more dangerous at the same time.

Distracted driving is the biggest cause of accidents but not the most fatalities. Impaired driving (alcohol) is still the most deadly with a higher chance of a fatality. Technology can also be to blame for the higher costs to repair with more driver assistance features (e.g., ADAS), and overall increased use of computer modules (i.e., chips) in vehicles. This means that a mild fender bender can cost several times more today because shops must replace multiple sensors (e.g., parking, lane assist, etc.), and other related systems.

Of the vehicles damaged in motor vehicle crashes in 2019, some 19.3 million or 84 percent were damaged in incidents that incurred property damage only.

This report indicates that the total cost from traffic crashes in 2019 was approximately 40 percent higher than in 2010. The difference in these estimates is attributable to a number of factors, including inflation, which accounts for an overall rise in the cost of goods and services of about 17 percent, shifts in the severity of crashes and the nature of injury outcomes, and a revised basis for measuring unit costs.

With OEMs introducing more and more safety systems such as ADAS and other crash avoidance systems, the methods and tools to repair modern vehicles are significantly more complex than even a decade ago, yet we are still trying to get people to wear seatbelts on a regular basis in 2023. Go figure. 📵

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



SELLING WELDING and collision tools to body shops

While it's more of a challenge to sell certain products like consumables to body shops, there's still room for the mobile tool dealer who pays attention to the needs of their customer and stocks the right mix of tools and equipment for this segment.

oday's collision repair facility is not like the traditional body shop from 30 years ago. It has evolved significantly along with the complexities of vehicles that manufacturers are producing today.

Welding equipment has also greatly improved in recent years to where it's easier for inexperienced techs to operate and still adjustable enough for the more seasoned ones to use. But there's a caveat, not all body panel repairs use the same type of welding processes. It depends on the manufacturer's requirements.

"Most body shops traditionally use MIG," says Jason Mahugh, director of engineering and technical services at Forney Industries, which makes welding machines and plasma cutters for automotive shops, and specifically body shops.

"Occasionally, body shops will TIGweld, but it takes more skill, and it's a bit slower. I don't see a lot of TIG in body shops. It's mostly multi-process (MP) machines, which are about the same price as a dedicated MIG welder. So a lot of customers prefer a MP machine instead of a dedicated MIG just for the value and versatility."

WELDING EQUIPMENT

Mahugh says they offer a wide variety of welders and plasma cutters designed for automotive uses from MIG to TIG and MP machines that can be operated in three modes (MIG, TIG, and Arc). But most body shops don't stick-weld unless they do general repair as well. Stick welding is not as precise but can handle very thick material.

"We develop welding machines and plasma cutters for thicknesses of around a half-inch and thinner. So that covers your typical automotive application. In terms of amperage for plasma cutting, we have a 20A plasma cutter, which is a quarter-inch machine, a 30A plasma cutter, which is a three-eighths machine, and a 40A plasma cutter, which is a 1/2" machine," says Mahugh, who notes that these are popular in body shops because they are easy to use and fast for cutting off panels.

There are several options when it comes to amperages in a MP welder, according to Mahugh. But much depends on the type of power your customer's shop needs or has available. Lower amperage machines will not weld as thick of material as higher amperages but will only require a 120V circuit, whereas a more versatile machine, such as Forney's newly launched 190 MP, can run on both 120 and 240V.

"Our 140A works for 1/4" material, and the 190A multi-process machine can weld up to 3/8". And then we have other machines that cover 1/2". So we cover the whole gamut," notes Mahugh.

While most body shops use MIG machines (whether a dedicated or a MP), in the past, there were some downsides to using a dedicated \Rightarrow

MIG machine, mainly because the technology made them more difficult for the beginning welder. And they were much more expensive and heavier. But today that's changing with new technology, which is allowing for easier manufacturing processes and more affordable options along with lighter weight.

"Twenty years ago, almost everyone used the dedicated MIG machine, and they were based on a transformer-style power supply. It was expensive and challenging to make a multi-process machine. But now that most welding machines are based on PCBs (printed circuit boards), it's much easier to make a multi-process machine with modern technology. It used to be that if you wanted to change from MIG welding to stick welding or TIG welding, it was challenging. It might take a technician five or 10 minutes to change over. It takes about 30 seconds to change from MIG welding to TIG welding. Technology has changed a lot in recent years. And so I would say nowadays, there are not a lot of downsides. We intentionally design our machines for quick changeover between processes and very simple controls, just for that reason, so it's easy to change."

With the changing technology comes lighter weight and more options from a manufacturing standpoint, so many body shops are now opting for the MP machines. Mahugh points out that while most techs use MIG for collision work, some of these body shops also work on weekend projects, such as a motorcycle or go-kart on the side. "The shop owner or tech may want to use TIG for the Chromoly tubing on his go-kart or something like that, or maybe even has a race car with a cage that needs to be welded. So that's where the value of the multi-process machine can come into play."

A MP machine can also stick-weld, but that's not a process used very often in automotive shops anymore unless it's for frame work or some sort of trailer accessory with very thick metal. Still, it's a good option to have when the need arises.

ALUMINUM REPAIR

One of the advantages to using a MIG machine or process is that you can weld steel and aluminum without much difficulty or training (especially with newer machines that are more automated for the correct amperages and wire feed speeds. More on that later).

"Normally, when you [weld aluminum] you use a spool gun that attaches to your MIG machine," says Mahugh. "And that allows you to feed the soft aluminum wire a short distance, which is a problem with MIG welding aluminum. The wire is so soft it's hard to feed 15 feet. So a spool gun with a small one or twopound spool of wire on the gun only pushes the wire maybe eight to 12 inches. It's much easier to push a rope 8 to 12" than it is to push a rope 10 or 15'. That's the concept with aluminum spool welding."

More independent body shops are welding and repairing aluminum than ever today, so Mahugh says it can be a benefit to have a MIG machine that is set up to do both steel and aluminum with little fuss.

"One of our machines (the 242 Dual MIG) is set up where you can run steel out of the machine, but then you can also have an aluminum spool gun hooked up, and all you have to do is flip a switch. So, one minute you're welding steel, and the next minute, you're welding aluminum with just the flip of a switch. There are things like that we try to accommodate because a lot of body shops are doing aluminum repair now. I almost never saw a body shop do aluminum 10 years ago. Now, quite a few body shops are doing aluminum, particularly with the Ford F-150, and some of the European cars use a fair bit of aluminum as well."

Some body shops may even want to set up a separate MIG welding station for aluminum just to keep them apart because some of the hammers and tools also need to be



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separated due to the risk of corrosion and cross-contamination.

SPOT WELDING

On the other end of the spectrum, more body shops, especially dealership body shops, are using high-end spotwelding machines that can give the perfect spot weld every time. One of the drawbacks of using a MIG machine to weld body panels is it comes down to the ability of the technician to properly perform multiple plug and spot welds over the course of the repair.

Squeeze-type resistance spot welders (STRSW) are the latest evolution of spot-welding machines that will hold the panel in place and apply the perfect amount of force for the electrode to bond, depending on the type of material used by the OEMs. With this process, panels are squeezed together with a specific amount of

pressure while the weld is created. Tips of resistance spot welders are made of copper, which is a better conductor of electricity than steel. These machines more closely mimic the OEM construction and introduce

less heat into the weld, which reduces the chance of corrosion. Also, many OEMs today use advanced steel alloys that are even thinner than in previous years when mild cold-rolled steel was more common.

PRE- AND POST-SCAN

Jason Pennington, a Mac Tools dealer in Dayton, Ohio, covers four routes in his territory now with four other drivers while he pulls a diagnostic trailer around with specialty tools. The trailer is equipped with tools such as scanners and larger shop equipment like an A/C recovery machine, a transmission jack, and an engine hoist, to name a few. It allows Pennington to go wherever he's needed to make a sale whenever one of his mobile truck drivers gives him a lead.

Pennington says he sells collision tools to many body shops in his area, including a few welders like the ESAB 210, which he says is so easy to use that it practically sells itself. However, he mainly focuses on selling diagnostic tools to body shops because he sees it as an increasing opportunity for his business.

"More body shops need scanners today to do pre- and post-scans before and after a repair job," he says. "Insurance companies pay per scan, so a shop could

make \$200 just to do a health check and ensure no major codes pop up."

While Pennington stays busy pulling his diagnostics trailer and selling big ticket items like MIG welders and multi-purpose machines that both MIG and TIG weld, he says his mobile route drivers handle more of the tool sales that collision shops need, such as Vise Grips (for body panels), specialty clamps and clip tools (Lisle), media blast wheels, and angle grinders. Those are the most popular items for body shops.

CONSUMABLES

Jay Sicht, who is the managing editor of ABRN and Motor Age, says that selling collision shops consumables such as sanding discs, cutters, drill bits, and so forth, could be a challenge for mobile tool dealers, depending on the area because many shops get deliveries every day, sometimes multiple times per day, from their paint supplier that sells some of these products as well. He says the tool

needs of body shops are very different than general repair shops and that visiting once a week may not be enough for their consumable needs.

Pennington agrees: "Body shops and general automotive repair shops are very different animals in terms of tool sales." While some general repair shops may buy a welder and even a few whiz wheels, they don't use them as often as a collision shop does. He says they have done well selling certain consumables to body shops because he typically has better quality products than the paint supplier, and he stocks them on the truck for whenever they need it.

Today's collision shop has changed significantly over the last decade, or more, due to the increased complexity of vehicles shops deal with day in and day out, according to Sicht. "Today's high-strength sheet steel is thinner and stronger, and there's more aluminum that shops have to be able to repair."

EPOXY BONDING AND STRSW

Furthermore, OEMs often require a specific epoxy bonding agent be applied to the panel before the welding process, so plug-welding will compromise the integrity of the weld, as well as the sealing from the bond. Consequently, more OEMs are requiring a specialized spot welder to make these repairs. Sicht says that shops are starting to transition to the newer squeeze-type resistance spot

welders because they can be set for the manufacturer's requirements, and they make a perfect weld every time, regardless of skill level.

While STRSW machines are quite expensive, Pennington notes that he's had good luck selling multi-purpose ESAB units because many techs are not necessarily skilled welders and can use this type of equipment with little or no welding experience. "You don't need to know the settings and look up specs in a book; you can just kind of set the dial to the material you're welding and thickness, and the machine does the rest."

For aluminum repairs, most MIG welders can weld aluminum by changing to a spool gun, but aluminum dent repair is another area of growth, according to Pennington. "We are getting a lot of shops now asking about tools for handling aluminum repairs. Many of these vehicles are now older and out of warranty which would typically be handled by a dealership collision center. Now, they're going into more independent body shops."

But what Pennington mostly focuses on is selling diagnostics to the body shops because they need pre- and post-scans. "I know some body shops are getting \$60-\$100 a scan per vehicle on a pre-scan. Then [the shop] makes that same amount again on a post-scan and can e-mail the report to the front office, which sends it directly to the insurance company."

The health reports are more for protection against any comebacks when you do a post-scan, according to Pennington. It shows the insurance company and customer there were no DTCs after the repair. He says that body shops are not using basic code readers anymore because they don't catch everything. "You need a bidirectional tool that can read all of the modules (i.e., body modules), and shops must update it regularly for access to all of the manufacturers." He says the subscriptions can run about \$50 a year per manufacturer, but it's worth it for the peace of mind. (1)



Tools with random orbital action significantly increase efficiency of the sanding process. The random orbital pattern left behind cannot be seen through paint.

STORAGE AND DISPLAY

The sanders are individually secured in boxes with highly visible printing. Dynabrade offers point of purchase displays to help feature the product, if necessary. The combo pack contains both sanders: one X31 and one X61H.

Top Diagnostic Tools for 2023

Training will help you gain the most value out of any tool or piece of equipment.

s a diagnostic tech myself, I'm always on the lookout for new tools that can help me do my job more efficiently. I usually find this to be an extremely challenging task because many of the tools I've been using for years are highly effective at carrying out diagnostic or investigative tasks I come across. However, there are tools I acquire that don't get used very often, but in certain situations, the tool can provide extremely valuable information that enables our shop to proceed toward the goal of finding the cause of the problem.

In most cases, a new tool will require new knowledge. For example, if you were to acquire a multi-channel lab scope and wanted to use it to identify engine valve to piston timing problems, then you, of course, would not only need to have good foundational knowledge around engine mechanicals, but you would also need to know how to set up and scale a pressure transducer and any other inputs you wanted to monitor. You would then need to know what data to collect and analyze, and document your findings to support your diagnostics. So, my suggestion is that with any new tool that you add to your arsenal, you will need to attain the necessary knowledge for achieving success.

The following is a list of the top tools that I admire consisting of some tools that I currently use and find highly valuable and some I may be acquiring in the future. Some are new, and some have been around for a while and may be hard to obtain. However, all are highly effective, in my humble opinion, so please stay with me, and let's check these out. Additionally, with more electrified vehicles entering the marketplace, we'll also explore some new tools to consider adding to your arsenal.

VISUAL TOOLS – INSPECTION CAMERAS

Sometimes you need to do a visual inspection that is nearly impossible to do without major disassembly. I've used multiple borescopes over the years, which I usually find extremely challenging. We've probably all seen the ultrahigh-end scopes used in the medical field and wondered why we couldn't get that level of quality. Well, we all know





the obvious reasons for this. One caution I'd like to mention here is that you want to avoid sticking the camera into a hot environment since this can result in destruction! Here are a couple of cameras whose specifications impress me.

FLIR VS80 - HIGH-PERFORMANCE VIDEOSCOPE

In addition to their specialty with forward-looking Infrared, FLIR has brought to market a new videoscope called the VS80.

The FLIR VS80 is outfitted with 1024 by 600 highresolution 7" touchscreen display and is available in seven different kits with the option to purchase waterproof, ultraslim probes that can be easily swapped in and out. Probe options include a 4.5mm diameter two-way articulating probe; a four-way articulating probe; a plumbing spool probe with a 25m cable; single HD and dual HD visible camera probes; a standard definition probe; and a general-purpose thermal camera probe.

VIVIDIA ME-610I - OASIS SCIENTIFIC

The ME-610i or ME-620 works with either an Android or Apple smartphone or tablet to view or record high-resolution



 $(1280 \times 720 \text{ pixels})$ images or videos using their free app USee. A 6mm flexible probe with an articulating tip can be helpful with examining areas normally not easily accessible. The unit also has a controllable LED light that surrounds the lens allowing the technician to control exposure.

I've been using a couple of different borescopes that produce varying results and come up short in many areas. I see an upgrade in this category coming soon.

SCAN TOOL DIAGNOSTICS – LOOKING TO THE FUTURE

Vehicles are increasingly being equipped with faster network protocols to support the growing number of electronic systems and features that are being integrated into modern vehicles. These systems and features include things like advanced driver assistance systems (ADAS), infotainment systems, connected navigation systems, and more. With these advanced networks, your scan tool interfaces need additional circuitry to communicate properly.

While CAN-FD is already supported within the GM MDI2, the Ford VCM2 is not. If you're servicing late-model

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GM or Ford vehicles, you may want to look at their nextgeneration interfaces. Ford has recently released the VCM3, which supports newer protocols, but due to the chip shortage, both tools have scarce availability. One solution is to look at the CardDAQ-Plus 3 from Opus. The CarDAQ-Plus 3 has some advanced future-proof features, such as supporting 4-CAN channels plus CAN-FD, in addition to being J2534 compliant. Additionally, the Mongoose Pro from Opus has also filled the void for some of those affected by chip shortages.

AUTOMOTIVE TEST SOLUTIONS – ESCOPE ELITE 4 OR 8 CHANNEL PC-BASED SCOPE

Both scopes have excellent features that can help a technician find the underlying cause of a difficult problem. Whether you're going in-cylinder to check camshaft/crankshaft synchronization problems, identifying injector or ignition problems, or any multitude of electrical challenges, the oscilloscope is a great asset. But as I mentioned at the beginning of this article, training is key to understanding how to leverage these advanced tools.

GODIAG BREAKOUT BOX – AESWAVE.COM


The GODIAG GT100+ ECU Jumper Cable with Banana Plugs allows technicians to connect to and power up one or more modules when performing module diagnostics, programming, or immobilizer work with the GODIAG GD100+ OBD2 Breakout Box. There may be situations where you need to isolate a module by powering it up separately on the





vehicle. The GODIAG GD100+ can be a tremendous help in this situation. Additionally, the connections discussed below can be used to connect the CANBUS circuits while performing certain diagnostic tests. According to AESwave. com, the ECU Cable for the GODIAG BOB was customized "to include 4mm banana plugs that make adapting to terminal connections easy, especially when combined with the uTest Advanced Terminal Kit or similar breakout leads." Also, the DB25 jumper cable features 37 color coded and labeled leads that are grouped together by function to make it easier to find the correct one. Each jumper lead terminates to a 4mm shrouded banana plug.





ELECTRICAL RELAY CIRCUIT ANALYSIS

When performing diagnostics on various power circuits controlled via a relay, I usually operate within one or more of the power distribution centers on the vehicle. This usually provides us quick access to the problem circuit on the vehicle without major disassembly. I have a tool that I've been using for over a decade that has helped me make quick diagnostic decisions that I'll talk about below.

UACTIVATE FROM AESWAVE.COM

The uActivate comes with various adapters that plug directly into the same socket your relay-controlled circuit under test consumes. It makes quick work for check-

ing relay controls, power, and ground, and provides one with various test points. I was informed about the latest version of this tool and was able to get my hands on one recently. This tool is new and improved in several areas, and I'm impressed. One of the cooler parts of the tool is that it provides a highcurrent loop that allows one to connect a current probe along with shrouded banana jack connections allowing one to monitor, measure, and activate circuits on the vehicle under test.

EV TOOL REQUIREMENTS

Love them or hate them, EVs will need service, and even if you're already servicing these vehicles, there are some new tools you may want to familiarize yourself with. As you'll see below, you'll also need to consider how to address infrastructure charging complaints as well.

AUTEL – INTELLIGENT EV DIAGNOSTICS FOR HYBRID AND BATTERY ELECTRIC VEHICLES (BEVS) MS909EV/ULTRA EV

Autel has recently introduced a new platform that takes Hybrid/BEV diagnostics to a new level. From the diagnostic port, most Hybrids and BEVs have diagnostic info available but in most cases, that data is limited. Autel's new offering brings forward a new EV diagnostic capability. Under the New Energy menu, one has all the modern vehicle scan functions, including the network topology layout and new battery cell data that can help with a health assessment. Additionally, the Battery Pack Test menu includes a highvoltage system block diagram, which provides guided pathways for the technician to remove the vehicle connection to the Battery Management System (BMS) and connect the scan tool to the new EV Diag. Box. This interfaces directly with power, ground, and communication circuits to produce a more granular dataset, including battery state of charge, health, total voltage, pack voltage delta, temperature, and more.

This information can help the technician gain a deeper knowledge of the high-voltage battery pack and controls.

EV CHARGER DIAGNOSTICS

The future will likely introduce problems where a vehicle cannot charge properly, and there may not be anything wrong with the vehicle. So how can one test a charger to see if it works properly? Fluke has introduced a new Electric Vehicle Service Equipment (EVSE) diagnostic tool that can help you analyze infrastructure chargers.





FLUKE FEV100

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This tool can simulate the presence of a vehicle and can perform various tests on the electrical circuits, including available voltage, pilot signal, GFCI functionality tests, and test the various charging states of the vehicle through a selectable knob on the tool. Additionally, the tool provides two female banana jack plugs where a properly rated DVOM can be connected for measurement.

FINAL THOUGHTS

There is no doubt that vehicles will continue to evolve and grow more complex, presenting the diagnostician with ever-increasing challenges. Thank goodness we have companies out there continuing to innovate and bring solutions to the market that help us save time and receive great returns on our investments. 😵

This distributing duo attributes their success to caring for their customers and community.

ach tool distributor has their own way of getting customers out and onto their truck. For Brian Wendl and Amanda Cunningham, a Mac Tools distributing duo, one of their main motivators is the sense of community they've created with all their customers.

"Our relationship with our customers is both business and friendship," Wendl says. "We love our weekends, both for catching up on work and for our favorite relaxing activities, but it's a rare one when we're not at a birthday party or shower for a customer-turned friend."

To better serve their community of independent shops and dealerships, Wendl and Cunningham decided it was time to get a newer, bigger truck.

TIME FOR SOMETHING NEW

In December 2019, the Mac team decided to order a 2018 Freightliner MT55 with a 22' box from Herr Display Vans. Unfortunately, due to COVID-19 they didn't end up getting their truck until around July 2020.

For the layout, they didn't exactly go with something standard, since the couple wanted to ensure there was enough space to fit a Macsimizer HD toolbox. Wendl notes that they "move a lot of tool storage," so some of the shelves on the truck were moved up to accommodate the toolboxes, and they also made their three toolbox openings a bit wider to adjust for boxes with side lockers.

Another design element on the truck includes 12 pullout drawers. Wendl notes that they love the amount of lay flat space the drawers give them for displaying products. Especially because of the rough roads along their route through Southeast Virginia into Hampton, Newport News, and Yorktown; it makes it difficult to remove products from their packaging and display them as many other trucks do if they're falling off the shelves. Though most of their space is

lay flat storage, they do have some vertical display shelves, as well as a power tool display rack and a diagnostic station.

On this truck, the couple decided to forgo having any magnetic rails. In the past, they've had issues with random sockets disappearing. They also changed up their desk setup. This time around, they chose to have an L-shaped desk that tucks into the side and allows them to look back over the truck. This allows them to see everyone while on the truck, and the duo loves having that ability.

AN AWARD-WINNING YEAR

Often, buying a new truck results in a boost in sales. Though Wendl and Cunningham didn't receive their new truck until the back half of 2020, it still played its part in helping them achieve No. 1 in the nation for Mac Tools.

The distributing duo swept the awards that year, winning Regional Excellence, Eagle Award, Presidents Club, No. 1 Single Truck, The Goodson Award, The Founder's Award, and a new award created that year— The Diagnostic Award.

"Our success is due to our strong work ethic and the care we have for our customers and community," Wendl says. "We try to give back every day for it."

The duo has found a multitude of ways to give back including giveaways for their customers, raiseing money for charity events, and donating items for raffle events for local organizations. Additionally, during the early days of COVID-19, they were able to source thousands of masks, regular and N95, and donate them to a local VA hospital.

To keep spirits high during the holidays, the couple started decorating the truck, and on Christmas Eve when many shops are closed, they still take the truck out to deliver donuts to the technicians who are working.

"At the end of the day," Wendl says, "we just strive to do our best. Our customers see that and appreciate it, and those relationships more than anything are really the key to our success."

If 'Wishin,' and Hopin,' and Prayin" don't pay the bills, more sales will

Major or Independent, there are limits on the number of customer opportunities and realistic hours in the day you can sell.

"Wishin' and Hopin'" was a Top 10 hit for Dusty Springfield in 1964.

s a mobile jobber for a major brand, you either have a set number of technicians on your route or a set geographic boundary controlling your selling efforts. Being an independent mobile jobber, your efficiency, selling time, and logic determine the ground you can successfully cover. Major or independent, there are limits on the number of customer opportunities and realistic hours in the day you can sell.

It's always easy to think that you only need a bigger territory or access to larger dealerships to be a Top 100 dealer (but this is probably not going to happen). You could wish for lower prices, higher margins, and fewer backorders (I guarantee that this is not going to happen). And finally, you can hope that one of your competitors drops out of the business since he is a price-cutting pain in your wallet!

So, if wishing, hoping, and praying are not going to help, there is only one thing remaining. You are going to have to accept the cards (aka, technicians) you've been dealt and make the most of it.

This month we're looking at ways for you to look at your customer and prospect base to build your revenues with the opportunities you have.

I imagine you have a good idea of who are all the absolute tool nuts, good customers, sporadic customers, non-customer prospects, and dead beats (cash only) that work in your area. I'm guessing that you have some document/spreadsheet/program with all the names of the technicians and shop owners in your area.

Let's start with the dead beats (cash only customers) in your area. No matter how bad at bill paying these technicians are, they still need tools to do their jobs. Granted they are probably buying many of their tools at Harbor Freight or some other discount location, but there are still some specialty products they can only get from a true automotive jobber – like you.

Don't ignore these people. You never know if their financial missteps are over or they are now somehow currently flush with cash. Talk to them, show them your new cool tools, and discuss a way for them to potentially get in your good credit graces. Maybe give them a plan that if they buy X amount from you for cash, you will start them out with a small credit line.

Talk openly but discretely with them about their issues, it's often surprising what a little communication can accomplish. Think of it this way, anything you sell to them is bonus business. Additionally, you will probably sell to these people at full-boat list price.

Your next target group should be the techs who are buying from someone else and not you. These are your prospects. Continue dropping off your promotional brochures and eyeto-eye thank them for looking at it and while you at it mention that you would appreciate a shot at their business.

In some cases, these non-customers might be mad at you, your predecessor, or the brand that is on your truck, and these issues are what you need to get past. Sometimes a simple request like, "How can I earn your business back?" may crack the ice and open a conversation. This conversation may not be all peaches and cream at first.

When they regurgitate whatever the previous sin (in their eyes) was, honor their statement with, "I'm sorry that happened, and I'll do my best to meet your needs as we move forward." Sure, the prospect may be a knucklehead and never forgive you for not taking back the broken lugnut socket that they had welded to a pry bar for busting loose frozen wheel nuts. Just keep asking. If this person is that odd, they will sooner or later become unhappy with their current supplier and come back to you. The successful action in this instance is to keep talking to them and asking for their business. Again, anything you sell them is 100 percent plus business.

The hardest nut to crack is the sporadic buyer. Are you their primary, secondary, or almostnothing supplier?

The hardest nut to crack is the sporadic buyer. Are they maxing out their credit with every mobile who calls on them? Are they trying to spread the wealth and keep everybody happy? Are you their primary, secondary, or almost-nothing supplier?

Try your best to figure out where you stand with this sporadic buyer. Are you No. 1,2,3, or 4 on their purchase scheme? You can mention that if they were to consolidate their purchases with you, you'll give them something in return. Better terms, cumulative discount, the first shot of what's new and exclusive. Something to make them feel special. Setting them up on a try-before-you-buy, one-week loaner program is a good way to get someone's interest. There is no need to give away

the store, just make them feel wanted and special.

The tool nuts, of which I am one, will buy almost anything new that hits the market. The challenge here is it is also probably new and available from all your competitors, too, unless it is exclusive to your brand. In this case, it is often true that the first mobile in the door with this cool new tool gets the business.

A great idea for your tool nuts is to develop an e-mail or text group list of these technicians, and the day you learn of, or get your hands on, a new tool, communicate it immediately to let them know about the product, and that you will be bringing it to them shortly. You can even give the your e-mail recipients the option of hitting reply and pre-ordering this product from you. Anything you can do to get them committed to you is the objective.

And finally, there are your good customers. The acronym KDWYD (keep doing what you're doing) is your first line of defense. Keep treating them like gold, telling them every week that you appreciate their business, and always, always ask if there's anything else you can do for them. As corny as it sounds, the motivational phrase, "Your best kept rose will soon wither and die if left unattended," fits your good customers perfectly.

Now, go sell something.
