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

The future of the automotive industry

Some key takeaways from this year's ETI ToolTech conference.

'm sure it'll come as no surprise when I say the automotive industry is changing. Actually, according to Steve Greenfield, founder and CEO of Automotive Ventures, "The automotive industry is going to see more change in the next 10 years than it's experienced in the past 100."

Greenfield was the day one keynote speaker at this year's ETI (Equipment & Tool Institute) ToolTech conference. His presentation along with many others discussed some of the changes we can expect to see in the coming years.

1. Electric vehicles are coming

Over the past few years, we've seen many statements from vehicle manufacturers saying that by 2035 or so, they'll have a fully electric vehicle line-up. With all these new EV offerings on the way, Greenfield notes that EVs will overtake internal combustion engine (ICE) vehicles in less than 10 years. He cites a study done by S&P Global Mobility that predicts by 2027 EVs will overtake hybrid vehicles, by 2029 EVs will overtake ICE vehicles, and by 2032 EVs will overtake both hybrid and ICE vehicles.

More interesting though, was Greenfield discussing how EVs are less complex and need less maintenance than an ICE vehicle. Software updates will handle many vehicle "repairs" without the need for a technician to even touch the vehicle.

2. The impact of AI

AI has become an increasingly large part of all our everyday lives. But what impact does AI have in the automotive industry? More than you'd think if utilized in the right way.

Mark Seng, vice president of business development for Predii, discussed how AI can be used to "unlock your historical data." This means that when a vehicle comes into your shop, AI can look up records from similar vehicles with similar issues to give you an idea of what parts may need to be ordered or how to fix the vehicle based on past repairs. No person can remember everything, but with AI you won't have to.

3. Challenges in today's shops

The technician shortage remains one of the biggest challenges plaguing today's shops. Mike Allen, owner of Carfix Auto Repair & Tires in Raleigh, North Carolina, had

an interesting take on the root of the tech shortage, saying that the skilled labor shortage was created by the auto industry itself through not paying well enough or providing benefits. Future technicians are being lost to other industries, not other shops.

To counteract this issue and bring new workers into his shop, John Firm, owner of Firm Automotive in Fort Worth, Texas, notes he gets creative with pay and benefits, tries to stay connected with peers in the industry, and works with a business coach to stay up-to-date with industry trends.

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

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
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Sensors for current and future vehicle systems: Understanding **ADAS** sensors, part 1

Diving into the technology behind cameras, lidar, infrared cameras, radar sensors, acoustic sensors, and others used in advanced driver assistance systems.




Today's advanced driver assistance systems (ADAS) are supported by various sensors and are paving the way toward future automation in next-generation vehicles.

he advanced driver assistance systems (ADAS) of today are supported by various sensors and are paving the way toward future automation in nextgeneration vehicles. You've likely encountered these systems where service operations required you to perform additional operations to maintain system integrity to support proper operation. These sensors could include cameras, infrared cameras, lidar (light, detection, and ranging), radar, and ultrasonic sensors. In this two-part article, we will take a closer look at different types of ADAS sensors and discuss how they are used to support ADAS and ultimately, SAE J3016 Level-5, fully autonomous vehicles.

CAMERAS

For at least the last decade we've seen most manufacturers deploy forward-facing cameras on some of their vehicles. The very early systems classified as SAE J3016 Level-0, mainly provided warnings for lane departure and potential collision events with vulnerable road users (VRUs). As computer vision (CV) technology advanced, ADAS became far more capable. CV and artificial 🤤



intelligence (AI) brought forward artificial neural networks (ANNs) capable of identifying the environment around the vehicle with object detection, classification, body pose detection, semantic segmentation, character recognition, and more, typically based upon industry standard "common objects in context" (COCO) datasets used for training perception networks.

DIGITAL CAMERA BASICS

A digital camera collects the light rays reflected from objects within the camera's field of view (FOV) which are passed through a series of concave and convex glass elements that make up the lens. Light rays passing through each layer are deformed in a way so that they are translated onto a flat plane. The flat plane hosts the digital sensor made up of receptor pixels. The light is first passed to the receptors via an array of red, green, and blue filters which are arranged in an out-of-balanced manner where 25 percent are red, 25 percent are blue, and 50 percent are green (Figure 1). Red, green, and blue are typically the primary colors used in digital photography because they are additive colors and the mix of adding these together at various levels allows for the closest

reproduction of the images for display.

If the imager has a resolution of 1920x1080, there would be an array of color receptors in the arrangement of about 500,000 red and blue filters and about 1.5 million green filters. From there, each pixel "borrows" the color information from each adjacent color receptor to fill in the other colors. This process is referred to as "bayering."


The lens elements help to capture the desired field of view (FOV) by the design engineer. This could be an extremely wide area such as required by a single backup camera sweeping up to 180 degrees (Figure 2). This can be classified as the extreme where straight lines are clearly distorted. This is where one level of calibration comes into play which we'll go into later in the calibration section of this article.

For automotive use, cameras are typically designed differently by eliminating the green filters and replacing them with clear ones. You may see this denoted as RCCB. The reason for this is that the clear pixels allow for better low-light sensitivity and lower noise because the sensor gain doesn't have to increase as much in such conditions. CV supporting ADAS doesn't need to see pretty pictures, they just need the

appropriate information leading to superior perception of the environment around the vehicle.

TOF CAMERAS — LIDAR

Time of flight (ToF) cameras typically work by emitting light pulses, typically in the infrared (IR) spectrum which we humans cannot see without special instruments, (see my video covering lidar here: youtu.be/K7NRdwpqaAI) and measuring the time it takes for the light to reflect from an object and return to the camera sensors. With this measurement, along with the speed-of-light time constant, the system can calculate the distance to the object. ToF cameras can be used for a variety of ADAS applications, such as ACC, AEB, and PAEB. They are particularly useful in low-light environments where other sensors may struggle to provide useful information. ToF cameras are becoming increasingly popular in the automotive

industry as they provide an efficient and accurate way of providing CV perception. However, these technologies are still rather expensive, but as their costs come down, we're likely to see more of them in the future. You may have already seen a lidar system on a vehicle passing through your shop. See Figure 3 to see if this looks familiar.

MONO CAMERAS

Mono cameras consist of a single camera that captures images of the environment. The camera's image sensor can detect light, and the camera's processor is able to interpret the data to produce an image. These images are then analyzed by the ADAS system to detect objects, such as other vehicles, pedestrians, and traffic signs. The technology of mono cameras has advanced over the years, which has improved their performance and capabilities for ADAS applications.

For example, early mono cameras used CCD image sensors that provided lowresolution images with poor low-light performance. Nowadays, most mono cameras use CMOS image sensors which provide higher-resolution images and better lowlight performance. Additionally, the processing power of mono cameras has also increased, which allows them to perform more advanced image analysis in real time.

Moreover, the use of deep learning techniques within cameras is continuously advancing. This has improved their ability to detect pedestrians, bicycles, and other objects, which is important for ADAS safety features such as AEB, PAEB, and LKS.


Most recently, Honda has been able to remove the radar sensor on some of their vehicles and still achieve the same or better ADAS functionality for ACC, AEB, PAEB, LKS, and more.

STEREO CAMERAS

A stereo camera system consists of two cameras mounted side-by-side, typically forward facing, that capture images at the same time. By comparing the images captured, the stereo camera system can calculate the distance to objects in the scene providing depth perception. This is accomplished by using epipolar geometry. The known distance between the

two sensors within the camera mounted on the same plane within the camera module can be used to triangulate the distance to the object being observed. Therefore, it is important to properly calibrate the camera following service events calling for those procedures. This information can be used for a variety of ADAS applications, such as ACC without the need for radar, obstacle avoidance, and pedestrian detection. The stereo camera system can also be used to create a 3-D map or sometimes referred to as a point cloud of the environment within its FOV, which can be used for navigation and localization. This 3-D mapping capability is particularly useful for autonomous vehicles, as it allows the vehicle to understand its surroundings and navigate accordingly. Stereo cameras are becoming increasingly popular in the automotive industry as they provide an efficient and accurate way of measuring distance, which is important for the safe operation of ADAS-equipped vehicles. See Figure 4 showing a 2022 Toyota Mirai equipped with a stereo camera and an array of other sensors.

Sensor calibration is an essential step in ensuring the proper functioning of these ADAS features. Sensor calibration involves adjusting and configuring the sensors to ensure they are providing accurate and reliable data to the vehicle's control systems.

CAMERA CALIBRATION

Cameras have two basic forms of calibration. The first (intrinsic) involves transforming three dimensions onto a flat plane with accurate representation. One of the challenges is the distortion that occurs as the light rays are passed through each lens element. The easiest way to visualize this, as mentioned earlier, is the viewing of straight lines on the flat image plane. This calibration operation is typically a "one and done" calibration performed at the time of camera manufacturing since it should not change. However, it is possible that there could be corrections applied dur-



ing field calibration. In photography, higher-end cameras with interchangeable lenses carry calibration data that is then transferred to the camera body when mounted and operated. The calibration information is used to transform the image properly onto the flat plane of the sensor image with little to no distortion. Keep in mind that what you see being displayed may not be the exact data the imaging system is using to accomplish its job as mentioned earlier.


The second type of calibration is called extrinsic. Extrinsic basically means external and how the camera placement on the vehicle is in relation to a known datum point (usually vehicle centerline) to its field of view. If the calibration routine is classified

as static, this means that there will be a requirement for a special target(s) to be placed in specific coordinates within the camera's FOV (Figure 5). Many of the modern tools today provide efficiency gains with target placement operations as they relate to specific vehicle data points.

This is very important to understand because if the system does not have a solid relationship between the camera view and the known datum point on the vehicle, then any of the warnings or corrective actions issued on an ADASequipped vehicle could have negative consequences. What this comes down to is that if there are changes to the vehicle ride height, steering/suspension geometry, or body-to-chassis changes,









then calibration operations should be considered by referencing the appropriate service information (SI). In some cases, you may not find direct statements within SI telling you that if you perform operation 'X' then you must do 'Y'. However, you may want to adopt a policy of your own. It all comes down to liability, and if you look from the courtroom perspective where the judge is looking at an owner's manual statement claiming that the AEB system may not work if the wheels are misaligned on a vehicle you aligned, and asks you why you didn't perform a recalibration on the camera when you, as the automotive service professional, knew that there is a relationship between the vehicle geometry and camera, you may be found at fault if you did not carry out the procedure. To date, I haven't been made aware of any such events I described above but they cannot be ruled out from happening.

CONCLUSION

Many service operations carried out today may require additional opera-



tions to be performed that relate to ADAS. Be sure to reference up-to-date service information to ensure that complete repairs are being performed on your client's vehicles. Returning a vehicle to service in proper operating order is an essential step today, especially with all the active safety systems being deployed on vehicles.

Servicing today's wheels and tires

Having the right equipment is key to properly servicing today's wheels and tires.

hen it comes to providing proper service for your customer's tire and wheel needs, you'll need to invest in the right equipment. You are going to need a tire machine, a wheel balancer, wheel weights, TPMS sensors, and a triggering device.

Unfortunately, you're not going to be able to service all makes and models with just one tire machine (unless you spend a large sum of money on equipment). When deciding on the equipment to purchase, you need to look at the types of vehicles that make up your fleet. For example, a high-end piece of equipment may not be needed for luxury brand vehicles and aftermarket rims.

For most of our fleet, we can service with just our rim clamp, but as part of our business model, we do quite a bit of work for local body shops where our Hunter unit comes in handy.

TIRE/WHEEL EQUIPMENT

When I purchased the Atlas TC755 Tilt-Back Rim-Clamp Tire Changer (Figure 1), I also purchased the two add-on accessory arms. The tire machine has been a great purchase for us, especially with the add-ons. The arms have made mounting low-profile tires so much easier. The tire machine we had prior to the Atlas did not have provisions for adding accessory arms which was a major reason for upgrading. Prior to the new machine, I used to dread handling low-profile tires. We do about 80 percent of all our tires on that machine and



▲ Figure 1 - Atlas TC755 Tilt-Back Rim-Clamp Tire Changer

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

have been very pleased with the ROI. We prefer to use the rim clamp as it does tend to be quicker than the Hunter unit. It's also more forgiving to work with. My technicians take to the machine quicker as there are fewer features than our other machine.

We purchased the Hunter TCA28 Tire Changer (Figure 2) used approximately a year ago. We needed a better alternative for the higher-end rims than just our rim clamp. The unit is a bit older, but it's in good shape, which is typically the case for Hunter equipment. It can be a little challenging to get used to, but as with any Hunter machines, they have refined it in the subsequent generations. General maintenance, such as lubricating all the moving points and making sure the air dryer is empty, has been key to the longevity of this machine.

Our wheel balancer of choice is the Hunter GSP9700 (Figure 3). This was one of my first purchases when I opened

the shop. It has been a great piece of equipment over the years. We have found many bent wheels with the Road Force Variation balancing. It's always comforting to know that you're able to diagnose a bent rim on the spot when servicing a vehicle. I much prefer to be able to give a customer a heads-up when they pick up the vehicle or even contact them throughout the course of the repair to keep them informed of anything out of the ordinary. It's also a great machine for luxury brands for finding potential vibration concerns. You can quickly eliminate whether it's a tire or rim issue with confidence.

ADDITIONAL PARTS AND TOOLS

It always amazes me all the ancillary items you need for complete tire service. For example, you'll need:

- · Valve stems
- TPMS sensors
- TPMS service kits
- Wheel weights
- Tire lube
- Tire repair supplies

It's funny that I often think of tire service as "simple," but there's really quite a bit to it. From the evolution of plugging tires to replacing them with patch plugs and the number of different valve stem designs to the selection of wheel weights, there's a lot more to it than first meets the eye.

Because there are so many wheel weights, we chose a wheel weight assortment from NAPA that the company comes out to stock at our shop (Figure 4). On this monthly sales call, they also check our tire repair supplies to make sure that we don't run out.

One of my frustrations for years has been TPMS systems. There wasn't one company that could do all manufacturers. These were simple systems that were forced on the industry in a relatively short period of time. Everyone, including manufacturers, had their own way of doing it and as a result, the industry was a mess.

One of the big things that I respect Autel for is their complete solution to TPMS. As with any aftermarket scanner, I am sure there are holes, but I have yet to run into any of them. We use the Autel MaxiSYS MS906TS (Figure 5) which has a great





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report feature that can be printed out to show the customers ahead of time to alert them to any issues. Autel also makes one sensor for all vehicles. I can now stock just one part with my scanner, and I have

100 percent coverage. The valve stems are changeable with the click of a button. Both aluminum and rubber valve stems are available. Don't forget to check the sensors on the vehicle before you begin

to service the tires. It's always better to identify a problem with a sensor ahead of time.

WHEEL ALIGNMENT

Our next step is wheel alignment. I am lucky that I am in Pennsylvania, and we still have a safety inspection program. My technicians are used to inspecting vehicle suspension systems. They are trained to do that before going on the alignment rack and catching problems ahead of time. If you have a chassis component that you just can't quite pinpoint, try doing a "dry steer test." By having the vehicle on the ground and having

another technician rock the steering wheel back and forth, you are more likely to find a loose component on the ground than while hanging it in the air. We use a Hunter Hawk Eye Elite aligner for our alignments. One of the great features of the machine is the tire clamp targets which have taken out all anxiety of potentially damaging an expensive rim.

Let's not forget the white elephant in the room, ADAS. Part of proper wheel and tire services these days should not only include a four-wheel alignment, but also any required ADAS calibrations. Where can you find out which calibrations the vehicle needs? Well, more and more we are seeing the Hunter alignment machine alert us that the vehicle is going to need a calibration before the alignment is started.

We also have a subscription to Mitchell's ProDemand and have found ALLDATA to have a great area to identify ADAS systems on vehicles and when they will need calibration.

As you can see from Figure 6, we have an Autel IA900WA Wheel Alignment and ADAS System next to the aligner. We do so many alignments and ADAS calibrations that we really need both machines. By not performing the required calibrations, you are setting yourself up for potential legal problems. I have had several conversations with my insurance agent on this topic and we cannot get a good answer as to how it would be treated. Not doing a calibration is no different than not tightening caliper bolts on a brake job.

Remember if you are in the tire business, you are in the ADAS business. 😵

Matco Tools Ratcheting Hose Clamp Pliers

Reviewed by Randy Kaiser, service manager at Rost Motor Inc. in Manson, Iowa.

Q: How did the tool function as far as saving you time?

A: The Ratcheting Hose Clamp Pliers do a great job of grabbing and holding onto those pesky spring hose clamps that manufacturers seem to be very fond of using. Without this tool, those clamps can be very tough, and time-consuming to grab and compress to release them, and just as time-consuming to reinstall. This tool cuts that time down considerably.

Q: How easy was it to use?

A: The hose clamp pliers are very easy to use. You select which side of the clamping head will best fit your hose clamp (there are two different grip ranges), slide it over the clamp, and squeeze the handles together. It has a locking ratchet mechanism to

PRODUCT DESCRIPTION

The Matco Tools Ratcheting Hose Clamp Pliers are ideal for removing plastic and/or metal self-tensioning hose clamps, adjusting from 11/16" to 3-1/8". Matco's dual jaw head features one side for small and standard size hose clamps and another side for larger clamps. The ratcheting design allows the pliers to lock in place with the component, freeing up the user's hands during repairs. 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hold the clamp open, and a quick-release lever to release the tension on the clamp to reinstall it.

Q: Was there a manual included?

A: There was no manual with the pliers, just some information printed on the cardboard piece that it was attached to. It's very self-explanatory, and no manual is needed.

Q: What features did you like?

A: The pliers have two different size clamping jaws so that they can accommodate clamps from 11/16" through 3-1/8". The grip handles have a nice, rubberized coating, making them easy to grip, and very comfortable to use. There is also a quickrelease handle to make it very easy to release the tension on the clamp.

Q: What types of jobs/repairs did you use this tool for?

A: I used the pliers to release spring hose clamps on heater hoses and radiator hoses during radiator replacement, water pump

replacement, and various other operations involving the cooling system.

Q: Have you used a previous version of this tool?

A: I have, but they weren't nearly as nice. The handles weren't padded at all, and the latch release didn't work nearly as well.

Q: Is there anything you had questions or concerns about in regard to the tool?

A: No, the pliers are well designed, well made, and do the job that they're designed to do. 😵

Electronic **Specialties Super Relay Buddy Pro Kit**

Reviewed by Mario Rojas, lead diagnostic tech at Autobahn Performance in Oakland Park, Florida.

Q: How did the tool function as far as saving you time?

A: It saves time by bypassing any setup of independent wires. It's designed with built-in relay receptacles, which makes it convenient for efficient relay testing.

Q: How has using this tool impacted your shop's profitability?

A: It made short work of multiple relay testing, which can have a tech fumbling for leads and wires—this tool prevents that.

PRODUCT DESCRIPTION

The Electronic Specialties Super Relay Buddy Pro Kit, No. 195, includes the Super Relay Buddy tester, plus three different adapters, which increases the test coverage to ten different 12V relays. The Super Relay Buddy incorporates a full 7A load into the automated test sequence, making it capable of finding more heat/ load caused failing relays. It also has a third test result (green for good, red for fail, and yellow for caution) and can test seven different 12V relays. To test, simply remove the relay from the vehicle, plug it into the relay buddy, and then press the "test" button until the test cycle is completed.

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Q: Did it come with any accessories?

A: It came with adapters for times when you must test shielded relays.

Q: Was there a manual included? If so, did you use the manual, and was the manual easy to understand?

A: Yes, a manual is included. It's easy to read and understand. I did use it to see if they mentioned any limitations, which it did. I'll explain further below.

Q: What features did you like?

A: I like the automatic 10-cycle testing with an easy red or green pass/fail result. I also like its ability to test four- and fivepin relays, and I love that it applies a load to the circuit of 7A.

Q: Is there any way you could think to improve or add to this tool?

A: The only drawback that I see is that you cannot test relays that are not designed in the conventional format. For example, BMW/MINI utilize a green-colored relay. The diagram reflects that of a conventional relay, but unlike traditional relays, the BMW/MINI relays have pins 85 and 30 parallel to each other and pins 86 and 87 perpendicular to each other. The receptacle of the tool is fixed and there is no way to test these relays using the tool.

Q: On a scale of 1 to 10, how would you rate this tool overall? Why?

A: I'm going to rate this tool a nine. It's so close to perfection. Maybe its successor will be the ultimate relay testing tool and the golden standard for relay testing in the automotive industry.



A: The Mobi-EVS EV4000SL makes a 1200 lb EV battery drop and reinstallation much quicker and safer, since we have control over alignment and maneuverability is improved. We are no longer raising and lowering the cars to remove or put battery packs up inside the cars.


Q: Have you used a previous version of this tool? If so, what are some new features compared to the old version?

PRODUCT DESCRIPTION

The BendPak Mobi-EVS EV4000SL **EV Battery and Powertrain Lift**

Table is a push-around full-rise scissor lift table that is ideal for EV service and battery pack replacement. The 40" by 60" platform is capable of lifting up to 4,000 lbs. With a press of the button on the pendant control, the space-saving lift platform elevates to more than 6' in less than 20 seconds, the company says. Other notable features include full-length utility trays on both sides, a stowable tow bar, a heavy duty 12V DC power unit with deep cycle battery, an onboard battery charger, manual floor locks, and zero-throw casters. The lift also meets or exceeds the standards prescribed by ASME PASE 2019.

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Q: Would you suggest any changes be made to the tool?

A: None—the design engineers did their application research and homework.

Q: How easy was it to use?

A: Once a 1200 lb battery pack is on the Mobi-EVS EV4000SL, two fingers can move it around with triple caster wheels.

Q: How was its packaging? Did it come with any accessories?

A: We received the unit in a wooden crate with accessories in separate corrugated boxes.

Q: What features did you like?

A: The four-corner leveling, slip table for precision lateral movements and alignment, single-hand push button controls, and heavy duty construction.

Q: What types of jobs/repairs did you use this tool for? Please provide a few specific examples.

A: We used this on Tesla Model S, X, 3, Y, and Roadster battery packs, as well as drive train assemblies out of the Model S, X, 3, and Y.

Q: On a scale of 1 to 10, how would you rate this tool overall? Why?

A: I would rate this a 10. It is an early edition of a new emerging EV service need, and the designers nailed it the first time. &

Streamlight **Stinger Color-Rite**

Reviewed by Randy Kaiser, service manager at Rost Motor Inc. in Manson, Iowa.

Q: How did the tool function as far as saving you time?

A: The flashlight is very handy to use and is a great size. It's not so small that you can misplace it, but not so large that it's too big and heavy to use. It comes with a charging dock that it can be stored in so that it's always ready to go.


Q: What features did you like?

A: This is a very well-built, very solid flashlight. It fits in the hand very nicely and has a serrated barrel for a non-slip grip. As stated in the name, this is a Color-Rite flashlight. That means that the light color that it puts out makes everything in the path of the beam appear in its true color. This not only works well for identifying paint color but is excellent for identifying

PRODUCT DESCRIPTION

The Streamlight Stinger Color-Rite is a rechargeable LED flashlight that uses a high color rendering index (90 CRI) LED for enhanced visualization under low light conditions, allowing users to see the color spectrum as they would in natural light such as to match and identify colors in auto applications. The compact light offers three variable lighting modes plus a strobe: high (500 Im, 17,500 candela, 265m beam distance); medium (275 lm, 9,000 candela, 190m beam distance), and low (140 lm, 4,500 candela, 134m beam distance). Run times range from five hours on the low setting to 1.5 hours on high. The light is anodized against corrosion and is IPX4 water-resistant.

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Q: How was its packaging? Did it come with any accessories?

A: The packaging is actually very nice. It comes well-protected in a heavy duty box. Included in the box are a charging dock with mounting screws, a 110V charging adaptor that plugs into the charging dock, and a 12V car charging adaptor that plugs into the charging dock. Additionally, there is a rubber protective ring that can be installed onto the front of the flashlight.

Q: What features didn't you like?

A: My biggest complaint so far is how difficult it is to get the flashlight into the charging dock. If the dock is securely fastened to a bench or toolbox, and you slide the light in from the top, it is doable. If you don't have the dock fastened down or try to snap the flashlight straight into the dock, it's fairly difficult to get in. Once it's in though, it definitely stays in place.

Q: What types of jobs/repairs did you use this tool for?

A: I used the flashlight for working under the hood, under the vehicle, and under the dash. It has plenty of light for any of those situations and definitely shows everything in its true color.

Q: Have you used a previous version of this tool?

A: I have used many different flashlights. This is definitely the heftiest and nicest feeling one of this size that I have used. It is also probably the highest-powered one of this size that I've used, but being Color-Rite, it's not a harsh light that's hard on your eyes. 😵

Kent Automotive Torrent Parts Washer

Q&A with Ilan Rodzynek, vice president of product and marketing at Lawson Products.

Q: What makes this product innovative?

A: What makes it unique is it combines three critical elements of parts washing into a single solution. One of those is heat. Even after scrubbing with a flow-through brush, some grease is going to be left behind when using cold water. It takes about 100 to 110 degrees to really get hydrocarbons or petroleum products to turn loose from many of the materials they're attached to, so the Torrent typically runs at 131 degrees, which is well above that temperature range. That heat element really delivers a cleaner product at the end of the day.

The second element is the chemistry. Most chemical reactions are more active in higher temperatures. Much of the chemistry that we're using is more environmentally friendly than some of the harsh chemicals that are used in competitors' products. The cleaning chemistry that we use produces zero VOCs and leaves behind the rust inhibitor for maximum protection of parts.


The third piece is the pressure. The pressure that the Torrent product delivers onto whatever surfaces are being cleaned blasts away tough deposits. It's 10 times more powerful than other cabinet washers. The water nozzle is powered by a recirculating pump that sprays water through the nozzle at 450 PSI. This nozzle is activated by a foot pedal and allows the user to direct the highpressure water-based cleaning solution into the nooks and crannies of the parts being washed. The hand-activated air blower releases a jet stream of compressed air at 90 to 150 PSI to dry and remove any other loose debris.

Q: How will this product improve the lives of technicians and shop owners?

A: Technicians are paid to work on your vehicles. Spending time cleaning parts is not really what they're being paid for, so saving time is a significant element here that'll make the technician and shop owners' jobs better—makes them more profitable as well. It also keeps the workspace safer. We're using this system as an enclosed parts-washing system. It's a solvent-free approach. Shop floors can be full of grease and grime from traditional over-the-sink washers that may splash. All those problems really go away when we talk about the Torrent washer. Employees will not be exposed to harmful chemicals and with minimal use of solvent-based cleaners, this will help shop owners achieve their ISO goals as well.

Q: What has been the feedback from technicians who've purchased this tool?

A: Probably the single most consistent feedback is wow, that did the job much faster, much more effectively than whatever alternate solution they had been using in the past.



A: We sell these machines outright, but there are also rental options available, and for every one unit we sell,

we probably rent out or lease 100 of them. The rental options that we do have for these units make them very affordable from a price point perspective. There are also service agreements that we have in place, so when you talk about having your Kent service rep out to service these machines, there are service packages associated with really what is a low-maintenance solution. &

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
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Keeping it in the family

year and a half ago, automotive technician Tiffany Morgan received what is arguably the best Christmas gift a technician could receivea new toolbox filled with tools. Working at the same Midas shop in Troy, Michigan, Morgan's father decided to retire and pass down his toolbox and everything in it to his daughter.

The setup consists of all Matco Tools products including a triple-bay toolbox, a single-bay toolbox, and two lockers, one on each side. Morgan had to add the second locker only a few months ago because she had already run out of space in the now 14' long setup. She notes that this is one of Matco's deepest toolboxes at

around 30-31" deep. Morgan's favorite part of the setup is her new side locker. She made sure the locker included a power drawer, so then she wouldn't have to keep all her power tools on top of her toolbox anymore.

To keep her box ready for work each day, Morgan likes to keep her tools organized in a logical fashion—similar-sized sockets grouped together in a drawer, SAE wrenches on one side and metric on the other, similar tools like prybars all clustered together, and so on.

Organization isn't a problem for Morgan, but she does note, "I just need more drawers." All the drawers in her setup are currently filled with tools and equipment, except for one drawer in her smaller side locker that's filled with nuts and bolts.

Funnily enough, Morgan's favorite tool isn't stored in her toolbox setup. Her TraXion Topside Creeper lives behind the setup and comes in handy whenever she needs a bit of a boost. At a height of 5'2", Morgan notes that "I kind of need [it] to get level to get up and do everything."

TOGETHER FROM THE START

Aside from her father's toolbox, Morgan also inherited his passion for working on cars.

"I started working on cars with my dad when I was two years old, and it just kind of stuck."

Morgan's now been working in this industry for almost ten years, and after that much time—and growing out of her fair share of toolboxes—she's picked up a thing or two on what to consider when purchasing a toolbox.

"You just [have to] see what all tools you have and how [they're] going to fit," she advises. "If you have to go bigger or smaller, it all depends on what you do every day."

FUTURE MODIFICATIONS

Looking ahead, Morgan has a few modifications she'd like to make to the setup, starting with green handles/trim. Currently, only her side lockers and the single-bay toolbox are sporting the lime green accents, but now that their shop has a Matco Tools distributor visiting them again, she'd like to update the triple-bay toolbox to make everything match.

Additionally, she's been thinking about adding a hutch and a mini fridge to her setup. However, she's still debating the hutch, as installing that would take away her workspace. 😵
