

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

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New Year's resolution: Do things better this year; the OEMs have your number

Independent shops need to keep investing in technical training, employee compensation and new tools and equipment.

t the start of a new year, it's natural to take stock of our prospects for growth and profitability. Looking back on 2012, the glass can be seen as half full, given the slight gain in consumer confidence and overall economic growth, or half empty, considering the challenges posed by a federal government intent on adding to the nation's debt and saddling businesses and consumers with higher taxes.

Trying to draw a conclusion from the myriad factors affecting aftermarket demand isn't easy. The automotive industry plays a big role in our nation's economy, and the news media is relentless in reporting every bit of information they can find to "enlighten" us on everything from consumer confidence to natural disasters to political debates, you name it. In their attempts to keep us informed, they mainly confuse us. So in the interest of making sense of this information overload, I offer my take.

Consumer outlook holds steady

The economic factors influencing the automotive aftermarket aren't changing fast. And that's a good thing. The independent aftermarket has been healthy despite the nation's generally lousy economy, and indications are that the industry is making all the right moves to sustain a strong status quo.

The aging of the nation's vehicle fleet, together with the increasing length of car ownership, still points to growth for the automotive aftermarket, according to Polk research. Cars bought in the last 10 years are lasting longer, and consumers know it. For most consumers, maintaining existing cars makes more sense than buying new ones. NPD, another research firm, confirms an overall positive outlook for the independent aftermarket. Consumers are starting to spend more money since the recession began in 2007. But not enough to encourage a lot of people to buy new cars. Most consumers are still holding onto their existing cars longer than they did 10 years ago.

This explains why the number of OEM dealers has been declining (since prior to the recession) and OE service sales have been flat.

OEs are hot on our trail

Digging into the finer details, there are conflicting indications about whether consumers expect to spend more on auto repairs in 2013. On one hand, higher fuel prices result in fewer miles driven and fewer repairs. On the other hand, used cars are more enticing in comparison to higher new car prices. And on still another hand, OE dealers are offering more liberal financing options to encourage new car sales.

The independent aftermarket has been healthy despite the nation's generally lousy economy, and indications are that the industry is making all the right moves to sustain a strong status quo.

One thing most observers agree is change isn't happening fast. And this is a good thing for independent shops.

The fact that shop operating costs have been inching upward has helped stabilize the number of shops (industry research confirms this), giving existing shop owners a better chance of sustaining their profitability. Wages, benefits, materials, maintenance, and tool and equipment costs are rising. But if they weren't, more competitors would be out there making it harder for those who are already established.

Hence, the short-term outlook remains healthy for independent aftermarket service providers.

This doesn't mean independent shops should be complacent.

OEMs are revving up efforts to change things. Fiscal 2012 ended on a positive note for new car manufacturers, thanks in part to the federal bailout that all of us paid for. Fiscal 2012 marked the best year for car sales since 2007, even if purchases did not come close to pre-2007 levels.

Independent shops must prepare for change

Independent shops need to be ready. So far, they've done a good job addressing the growing demand for aftermarket services. Outlays for new tools and equipment have moved at a healthy clip in the last several years, and most forecasts see this continuing for at least another two or three years.

Automotive tools cost more because they do more. Newer scan tools, for instance, make it easier to diagnose problems faster and get cars out the door in less time.

The outlook remains positive for those shops committed to investing in technical training, competitive employee compensation, and investment in the tools and equipment needed to address a more diverse vehicle fleet.

Team relies on parts, equipment and tool partners for optimum performance

or the Kalitta Motorsports team, success is measured not only in the speed of the race cars and the number of winning Wallies (drag racing's most competitive award), or the coveted trophy of the NHRA. The team enjoys the passion of drag racing and the family atmosphere instilled by company founder Connie Kalitta, and in the adrenalineintensive, competitive world of drag racing, the bar rises every year.

Kalitta Motorsports' four race cars – two Top Fuel and two Funny Cars – now compete in 24 races a year, placing major demands on the assembly and repair crew. To meet the challenge, the team relies on the cooperative spirit of its 60 employees and its parts, equipment and tool partners.

While race fans may be familiar with Kalitta Motorsports celebrity drivers like Alexis De Joria, Del Worsham, David Grubnic, Doug Kalitta and Conrad ("Connie") Kalitta, the responsibility for keeping the cars running at optimum performance falls to the entire crew.

Under the supervision of Jim Oberhofer, vice president of operations,

the staff remains passionate about the assembly, maintenance and repair of the cars at the facility in Ypsilanti, Mich.

"Trying to keep that competitive edge is huge," explains Oberhofer, who is now in his 25th year with the Kalitta team. "We win and lose races by thousandths of a second. To remain competitive, we have to make sure the chassis are as fast as possible."

The team uses a combination of OEM- and custom-made parts to remain competitive. The team assembles two to three cars per year, Oberhofer notes, and competes in a race almost every month of the year.

A custom-designed work space

The 50,000-square-foot building at the Kalitta headquarters was constructed 10 years ago in an industrial park to meet the growth of the team, which 74-year-old Connie Kalitta started in 1957. The rectangular building houses an open work area where technicians attend to maintenance, assembly and repair.

The work areas include spaces for parts assembly, tire work, brake repair, and a soundproof room for analyzing the air flow of the teams' blowers, an important part of creating speed for the engines. Seven 53-foot-long semi trailers

that transport the race cars, pit crews and tools to and from races double as movable partitions inside the main work area, designating areas for specific tasks. The building also has business offices and storage areas.

Repair stations share the same open work area as the assembly. There are five dedicated repair technicians. Thirty company-owned toolboxes are positioned throughout the general work area. The repair techs also work on the transport trailers. Each tech is responsible for the tools in a section of the shop.

Everything is assembled in-house. Painting and testing are done off site. The company custom-builds over 100 parts. While they don't make their own engine blocks, they do repair them, along with cylinder heads.

The engines are assembled according to National Hot Rod Association (NHRA) specifications for Top Fuel Dragsters and Funny Cars. Crankshafts, pistons, valves, connecting rods, cam shafts, gears, front hub lifters, piston rings, superchargers, clutch discs and bearings are used to assemble the engines.

Preparation for future events is also done at Kalitta headquarters. "It's a constant rotation of parts," notes Oberhofer. In meeting the NHRA specs, the team has the flexibility to experiment with different clutch and cylinder head configurations. "We're planning a whole year out for clutch parts right now," Oberhofer says. "Everything is so specialized with these cars that you have to plan ahead or you fall behind." for future needs is challenging because parts are becoming obsolete faster.

The highly sophisticated engines are inspected regularly to determine wear. The cylinder walls of the engines must retain a specific size. They get replaced if they get "out of round." A dial board gauge is used to determine this.

The growth in electronic components has made parts assembly easier in the time that Oberhofer has worked at Kalitta. "It's actually easier to work on this stuff now," he says.

Tools of the trade

While the tools used in the assembly have changed over the years, the pit crew tools have not changed as much, since race car engines have not evolved the way regular car engines have. "Our stuff reminds me more of the cars in the sixties and seventies," Oberhofer says of the pit crews' tools. Kalitta Motorsports relies on Mac Tools for all of its standard tools.

Certain tools, such as line borers, mills, lathes, valve grinders, soldering guns and wire crimpers are used more in parts making than in maintenance.

Soldering guns and wire crimpers are used to make wire harnesses for electronic ignitions.

A valve grinder cuts engine valves to a precise length to get the right angle on the base of the engine. An intake valve has a 55-degree "seat." A grinder makes the seat a precise 55-degree angle on the intake side.

A dynometer in a soundproof room allows a tech to use an analyzer to test the *CONTINUED PAGE 12*

airflow of the teams' blowers.

Kalitta Motorsports serves as a tool test laboratory for Mac Tools. Mac Tools recently developed a wrench used for tightening the inner head nuts of cylinder heads and other delicate tasks. Mac Savage, a clutch tech, told Mac Tools he wanted to see more weight on the handle in its precision torque wrenches, for a more solid grip. The pit crews play an important role in the success of the race team. The engine must deliver as much horsepower and torque as possible through the clutch to the rear wheels without the wheels losing traction. The biggest challenge the pit crew faces is being able to work fast as a team during the races. Each of the two pit crews has one person in charge of making sure tools are accounted for.

"Every time that engine runs, it has to be torn apart," explains Bob Lawson, Kalitta Motorsports business manager, who grew up in a racing family and has spent his life in the business.

The marketing effort has increased significantly over the years as parts and tool manufacturers have partnered with racing teams to promote their products. Drag racing gets great media exposure for partners such as Mac Tools.

Mac Tools has used other partnerships to leverage its drag racing ties, such as bringing rock stars like Kid Rock to events. "Anybody that's a fan of his is going to associate him with us," notes Lawson. "You make these people (fans) feel exclusive." While marketing to the public, Mac Tools also invites shop owner customers to races. Professional customers recognize racing represents the most demanding use of their tools.

Who gets to be on the drag race pit crew?

Success in motorsports relies on a competent pit crew as much as a talented driver. Kalitta Motorsports, like other race teams, has recognized the importance of identifying good candidates for the pit crew. But veteran team managers like Bob Lawson, business manager, is quick to note there is no formula for identifying a good candidate for this very important role.

"There's no educational property that teaches you how to work on a race car," says Lawson.

Candidates need to have a commercial driving license, a high school diploma and some mechanical aptitude. Beyond these simple requirements, the main quality they seek is a personality that will fit in with the rest of the team. This is an intangible quality that teams learn to identify with experience. Candidates are interviewed extensively by different people in management. Several technical schools send the company candidates for these positions.

"Chemistry (among the crew members) is the most important thing for us because of the amount of time the team must stay on the road," notes Lawson. "Youth and enthusiasm are two pretty important things. If they start out with the right character, we can grow on that and teach them the things they must know."

Chemistry refers to the ability of crew members to communicate under pressure. During a race, the driver calls to the crew chief for changes needed once he gets a sense of how the car handles on the track. The crew chief then oversees the crew in making sure these things get done. Every team member must understand what he must do.

Lawson says some people come to the drag racing field thinking it is glamorous. Some think the position is a way to get on national television. He says it's easy for the Kalitta team to determine which candidates have this misconception and which ones understand that the work is very demanding of members' time. "Once you do the interview process, you can pretty well weed people out," he says.

In time, the techs earn the respect of the crew by demonstrating their technical competence and their ability to work with the team.

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SP Tools Racing-bred tools

SP Tools stems from a racing tradition that has inspired their industry-leading specialty tools.

It all began with brothers Paul and Mark Schley, who were just a couple of kids interested in race cars.

"The first car we had was a 1963 Volkswagen [Beetle]. Before that we were building go-carts and other motorized things. We always wanted everything to go fast."

The now internationally famous "Lightning Bug" was the first Beetle to do an under 10 second quarter mile, reaching a speed





of 126 MPH in that time—all without a turbo, supercharger, nitrous or other easy ways to attain such speed. Having won 18 NHRA drag racing records, it

had modifications that the Schleys designed on their own such as a heavy-duty rocker shaft and a heavy-duty washer that secured the upgraded flywheel.

"While we were working on this car, we were using specialty tools to make the job quicker. We even began making some of our own, about four or five of them, amongst the modified parts we were making. So, we called the company 'Schley Products,' because we were not initially focused on any one particular thing."

Their real breakthrough out of racing modifications and into the tool industry came in 1986 with their brake caliper tool that helped compress difficult GM calipers. It won the top award for tools at that year's SEMA show and Snap-on, amongst other distributors, started selling the Schleys' tools. Since then, they have never looked back.

Yet, the Schleys maintained their racing roots. They raced a 1996 Viper GTS Coupe in the 90s and 2000s, an upgraded VW Beetle capable of a nine second quarter mile, and then resurrecting the Lightning Bug herself. The famous blue bug now travels the world, including Europe and Japan wowing crowds that love vintage race cars.



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Q&A with Kylie Hirko of PTEN. An interview with the President of Redback USA, Thomas Meyer

Q. How did you get into the footwear industry?

A. In my travels to Australia collecting plants, my fellow collectors gave me a pair of Redbacks to help get around the outback. They were great dealing with their harsh conditions and I noticed two years later how well they had lasted. I went back to Australia and visited the Redback Factory, met the Cloros Family and found they had been making boots for over 100 years. I asked if they needed an importer to North America and ordered my first container. Afterward, I found out how easy they were to sell.

Q. So my big question is, Thomas, how did you break into the auto industry?

A. Well, I gave a pair of Redbacks to a transmission tech friend. He later told me how great they were against slipping and the harsh elements in his shop. In 2000, Matco Inc. wisely began selling Redbacks on their mobile tool trucks and now we are available on just about every mobile tool truck.

Q What new technology did Redback bring to the Auto Industry?

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The combination of technological features into one product creates a phenomenally durable, comfortable safe work boot that folks in this hard working industry appreciate, along with what we like to consider world class customer service, all have made Redback a big success.

Q. How has Redback been involved in racing?

A. On the frontlines, distributors promoted and distributed Redback boots to the racing community. We've also sponsored various teams and soon became known as the boot that takes you "From Zero to Comfort in 3.2 Seconds."

Q. What do you envision for the future?

A. We are always thinking of ways to build our brand and make it easier for distributors to sell Redback. We've taken feedback from our customers and have added scratchless belts, insoles and socks to our line – all made from the finest products from the U.S. to New Zealand.

Fuel trim issue: 'Mini' problem, but big headache

CUSTOMER CONCERN:

Code P2096 indicates that the rear O2 sensor registers a long-term lean condition. There is a technical service bulletin, No. M12 01 06, that addresses this problem. Small leaks at exhaust system welds and flange gaskets as well as at bungs for O2 sensors are relatively common, and can be found by pressurizing the exhaust system and using a soapy water solution to look for leaks, indicated by bubbles.

TOOLS USED:

- Scan tool
- Injector cleaner
- Fuel injection tester
- Smoke machine
- Exhaust gas analyzer

STEPS

TESTS/PROCEDURES:

Check long-term fuel trim values. Expect a value >5 percent positive.

Test operation of front and rear 02 sensors - the front should switch high and low in the range of 0-1 V, and the rear should maintain a relatively steady 0.5V-0.7V at idle.

If the front sensors switch normally, the rears stay low, generally.

If the above tests come out okay, try cleaning injectors.



customer's 2005 Mini Cooper has a "check engine" light. After scanning for DTCs, you see you have a P2096, indicating that the rear oxygen sensor is experiencing a long-term, lean condition. Thankfully, there is a technical service bulletin (TSB), No. M12 01 06, that addresses this problem.

The TSB refers to exhaust leaks at weld spots, gaskets and at the bungs for the oxygen sensors. BMW recommends putting a restriction into the tailpipe and spraying soapy water on leak points while letting the car run. There is also an Identifix quick hit on the problem, indicating that if the O2 sen-

sors are not stuck lean, that clogged fuel injectors have been known to throw the P2096 as well.

Several tools can help find the problem the easy way. First, forget the

soapy water! Use a smoke machine. Other tools will also help cut down on diagnostic time, including an emissions analyzer, bottle of propane and a scan tool with strong European-

enhanced capabilities.

STEP 1: IS IT REALLY LEAN?

Since we have a rear oxygen sensor reporting lean, and both a TSB and an Identifix quick hit indicating different causes that might lean out the sensor, our first step is to confirm what is going on. Do we have a vehicle that is running lean (exhaust leak at the front oxygen sensor, vacuum leak on MAF vehicles, front oxygen sensor "stuck lean," clogged injectors, weak fuel pump, etc.) or just a lean rear sensor (exhaust leak before the rear O2, rear O2 "stuck

Scanning for codes using the Autologic gives us our first clue. As we can see in "fuel system status," the vehicle sets the code near instantly in open loop. For information on this product, go to www.VehicleServicePros.com/10441342.

lean," or mixture adaptation not done with a scan tool)?

With some scan tools, we can connect to repair databases such as Identifix. We need the test plan from Identifix or any other troubleshooter test tips if we do not know how to test to see whether the vehicle is running lean. What any of these databases cannot teach us is how to interpret long-term fuel trim (LTFT) values. This value is almost entirely dependent upon the front oxygen sensor. If the vehicle is really running lean, expect the LTFT to be above +7 and the front O2 to be steadily below 450mV.

Now, if LTFT is in a normal range (+/-7), indicating the vehicle actually isn't running lean, but the rear sensor thinks it is, the rear O2 is defective and merely shifted lean (or is being tricked by an exhaust leak forcing it lean).

Another strategy, if analyzing fuel

To smoke the exhaust, simply block one of the tailpipes and put the smoke machine in the other. For an exhaust leak to be bad enough to throw off an oxygen sensor, the leak will be large enough where the smoke will be clearly visible. 
trim issues is difficult, is to simply place an emissions analyzer in the tail pipe and make sure your lambda is close to 1 (give or take +/- 0.03). If there is perfect lambda or good LTFT, but a code appears for a lean rear sensor, be assured the vehicle isn't actually running lean but the rear sensor alone is stuck lean.

STEP 2: O2 SENSOR TESTS

On the scan tool, if the O2 in the front is switching between 150 and 850 mV, but the rear one is stuck low (around 0 to 300 mV consistently), then we know that only the rear O2 is being forced lean because it is defective or there is an exhaust leak. If the front sensor stays consistently below 450 mV, then the rear sensor will likely be low, too, because something is forcing the whole system lean (front oxygen sensor stuck lean, vacuum leak on MAF vehicles, etc.)

Since these sensors go bad all the time, what's a quick way to test them? Use a scan tool and a bottle of propane. Simply add some propane through the ABS brake booster hose to see if the front oxygen sensor mV goes up. If the front

oxygen sensor does not budge but the rear one does, the front one needs to be replaced. Conversely, if the front sensor nudges but the rear one does not, the rear needs replacing.

If both sensors change readings thanks to propane, it's time to use a smoke machine. There might be an exhaust leak around one of the sensors throwing the reading off. To smoke the exhaust, block one of the tailpipes and put the smoke machine in the other. For an exhaust leak to be bad enough to throw off an oxygen sensor, the leak will be large enough where smoke will be clearly visible.

If there is no smoke machine available, use an emissions analyzer to look for elevated HC, which would be typical of an exhaust leak, around critical leak points as per the TSB.

Without any exhaust leak or an oxygen sensor problem, there is something else making the vehicle run lean. Since it is easier to check the intake system as opposed to the fuel system, it makes sense to smoke the intake through the ABS brake booster hose. However, the Mini is a speed-density system that would run rich with an intake leak, not lean, so the proper approach is to diagnose the fuel system.

STEP 3: TEST THE FUEL SYSTEM

On many vehicles, the easiest thing to check first is the fuel pressure simply by hooking up the fuel pressure gauge to a testing port, often on the fuel rail. On a good Mini with a supercharger, KOEO and KOER fuel pressure should be about 3.5 BAR/53 psi. A regular Mini should be about 3.0 BAR/43 psi. If fuel pressure does not meet this spec, Identifix suggests cleaning the fuel injectors. However, it is wise to rule out the fuel pump first on most vehicles.

The fuel pump on Minis is extremely hard to connect to with a fuel volume tool, but it is doable with modifications to the frame around the pump. For this reason, it makes sense to check fuel volume only after checking the fuel injectors. Keep in mind that this vehicle should flow at least 0.6 GPM.

So, we rule out the fuel pump by process of elimination by moving on to the fuel injectors first. To test the fuel injectors, remove the intercooler and connect a fuel injector tester to each fuel injector with a fuel pressure gauge connected to the fuel rail. The directions on how to use different fuel injector testers might differ a little, but essentially all that needs to be done is to connect the tester's power and ground to the battery terminals, fit the plug into the injector, and select the amperage for the injector. Then activate the tool, which duty cycles the injector.

There is an injector problem if the pressure at the fuel rail differs between different injectors. Remember to start the car after testing each injector to avoid "hydrolocking" the engine.

An off-car fuel injector tester can do a more accurate job of testing fuel injectors. Simply plug in fuel injectors with the right fittings and perform a uniformity test. If there is a difference in a spray pattern between injectors, where it looks uneven or the volume of what sprayed is different, the injector spraying deficiently has a problem. A difference of about 7 percent in spray volume indicates an injector issue that would cause a drivability problem. Injectors otherwise will have slight deviations in spray volume, but that is nothing to be concerned about.

STEP 4: FIX THE PROBLEM

If we have a bad fuel injector, there is not a fuel delivery issue causing the vehicle to run lean.

The best method to fix the problem is to clean all of the fuel injectors with an ultrasonic fuel injector cleaner so they have equal performance. The tool simply pulses the fuel injectors on and off while the pintles bathe in a vibrating bath of ultrasonic cleaning solution. Always use approved fluids to clean and test fuel injectors to prevent damage.

If the fuel injector is out of the car, change the screens on the top by sticking the pointy head of a slide hammer in, popping the screen out and sticking a new screen in.

Minus the luxury of fixing fuel injectors out of the car, use an on-car fuel injector cleaner tool. Connect the tool to the fuel rail and pull the relay out for the fuel pump. Add shop air to the tool, which then delivers the fuel injector cleaning solution to the injectors. Then, run the car using the solution as fuel. Some people dilute the solution with gasoline to make it last longer. Typically, fuel injectors cleaned this way will clear up over time, if not right away. Other times, a second cleaning is needed.

Last but not least, use the OEMenhanced scan tool to perform a fuel mixture adaptation. Without a scan tool with dealer-level capabilities, this adaptation cannot be performed and the P2096 will instantly return.

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Should you get involved with reflashing?

Learn more about reflashing equipment, and how to avoid nasty pitfalls.

What should I look for when shopping for J2534 equipment?

First, you need the J-Box itself. They all cost around the same, so what you should be interested in is whether the piece of equipment is approved by the OEM. You can look this up at www.NASTF. org by looking at the "Reprogramming

Information" section on the left side of the page. The National Automotive Service Task Force (NASTF) makes all this information on every OEM readily available in one place. Second, you'll need a battery maintainer. You need a good, low-AC ripple flow of high amperage during a reflash, and only a battery maintainer can provide this. Third, you need a laptop with Windows 7. The reason is that in the real world, you are going to need to be mobile when it comes to reflash, and the more

wires you have hanging all over the place, the greater risk you take of killing a module. Furthermore, most J2534 applications are transitioning from Windows XP to Windows 7. Windows 7 has an XP emulator that allows you to use applications that only work in XP. However, an XP emulator is very slow, so if you can get the reflash software running in Windows 7 itself, it's best to stick with it. (See **Fig. 1** and **Fig. 2**)

Can I reflash all modules on all vehicles?

No, not really. Most manufacturers allow you to reflash PCMs and TCMs at most, so that you can solve an emissions issue. Now, reflashing a BCM has nothing to do with emissions, so they won't support it. There are some notable exceptions. Toyota and GM are two examples of manufacturers with a two-day, \$55 subscription that allows you to reflash anything you want with the J-Box. (**Fig. 3**) Volvo and BMW are the same, but they are difficult to use and costly for some (Volvo is \$225 for a few days).

I have heard a lot of horror stories about frying PCMs. How do I avoid doing that?

Nissan recommends turning off your cell phone and ■ putting a large piece of paper on the car that says, "This vehicle is being reprogrammed. Stay away!" Now, you might not actually need to do this, but in the real world there are a few precautions you do need to take. In no particular order, here are a few. You should not be working with any tangled wires. Keep everything neat, because anything that might interrupt a reflash, like a lack of communication to a piece of hardware, can cost you the module, and you know you don't want to have to pay for that. Always double check that your DLC, USB ports and power cables are fully connected

and not jiggling.

Another precaution you should take is making sure your battery maintainer is hooked up properly to the vehicle's battery or to the jump-starting posts. Make sure you plug it in where no one else in the shop might walk by and kick out the wire by mistake. (See **Fig. 4**) Also, make sure that your laptop has its Windows, Flash and Adobe updates all completed before you reflash. If any of these begin in the middle of a reflash and reset your computer, this can cause problems with on-board modules.

Lastly, make sure that anti-virus software is disabled. If the program automatically opens up when you are in the middle of reflashing, obviously that's not good. It's best to have a laptop that you use exclusively for automotive use, so that you don't need to worry about virus protection or programs that can cause conflicts with one another. (See **Fig. 5**)

Where do I learn more about J2534 reprogramming?

There's no shame in knowing that there's always more to learn. Oftentimes it's best to learn it by real-world experience, being taught by someone who knows how to actually do it on a real car. However, if no one is willing to make you their J2534 disciple, do not fear! You can get some training from instructors at training events, whether they be regional associations (i.e.,

Technicians Service Training in the Northeast) or national events (i.e., VISION). There might even be a handson trainer in your area. Training DVDs from a few providers (such as Technicians Service Training and AVI) also cover the topic.

A few free resources exist online. DrewTech's website (www.DrewTech. com) and the "OTC Tool Guy" YouTube channel (See **Fig. 6**) are very good and cover car-line specific reflashing. OTC Tool Guy's videos, for example, in about six minutes cover exactly how you register on an OEM website and subsequently carry on your reflash. They have a lot of essential, real-world tips. In their video on reflashing

Nissans, they warn you that after a successful reflash, the software uses the word "failure," and cautions the technician not to be afraid. That tip comes in handy when you reflash your first Nissan so you don't freak out and think you fried the module.

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

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

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

Master Appliance ProHeat LCD Dial-In Heat Gun

Heat gun allows user to lock in temperature and fan settings.

aster Appliance's UL-certified ProHeat LCD Dial-In Heat Gun, No. PH-1400, features separate, easy-touse controls for digitally displayed temperatures in 10-degree F increments, from 130 degrees F to 1,000 degrees F. It displays in Fahrenheit or Celsius; air flow is adjustable from 4 cfm to 16 cfm. The Proheat LCD Dial-In Heat Gun Kit includes the PH-1400 heat gun, five specialty attachments and a carrying case.

The Review

Lou Fort, lead technician at K.A.R.S. Inc. in Huntingburg, IN, understands that the heat gun is often an uncelebrated, but necessary, tool. After receiving the ProHeat for reviewing purposes, he immediately put the tool to work on needed wiring repairs and decal work in the shop.

Right away Fort noticed that the "lock in" feature that allowed him to adjust exact temperature and fan settings was helpful. "Being able to lock in both a temperature and fan-speed setting for repetitive work is a major plus," he said. "By locking in your settings when doing these jobs, you won't have to set up the gun each time."

Most of the tool setup was reportedly user-friendly. Fort found that the user can choose between using the fan only or fan and heat with "a simple flip of a threeposition (OFF/FAN/FAN & HEAT) switch."

He observed that "once you have made that choice, setting the desired fan speed and/or temperature requires turning the adjustment knobs on the top of the unit. Setup may also include locking, if desired, the settings with the use of a magnetic key. Picking Fahrenheit or Celsius for the temperature display is also possible if desired; this also takes the magnetic key supplied with the unit."

Fort was most impressed by a subtle safety feature that reflects the tool's overall attention to detail: "The unit has a built-in safety feature that ... keeps the unit from turning back on by itself in the event of a power loss. Here is a quick explanation of how it works: Say you have the gun sitting on a bench all powered up and running when, wham, out go the lights. If you were to just walk away to investigate this sudden loss of power and it happens to come back on while you were away, the gun will not turn back on by itself. Rather, the unit will display 'OFF' and require you to turn it fully off and back on to restore its use."

Fort appreciated that the product was manufactured in the U.S., and thought the packaging should proudly display the product's origin.

He also made one suggestion for improvements on the tool: He found using the magnetic key for adjusting the tool's settings difficult to use, simply because he did not know where to put it.** "Either place a decal or make markings on the rear housing that



would aid in proper placement of the magnetic key," he suggested. "I feel that this was a small detail that got overlooked when they improved the gun's stability by removing a locating pad that had key placements in it."

He contacted John Brott from Master Appliance regarding this. "[He] promptly returned my email, and called me," Fort said. This conversation "made 'key' placement a no-brainer."

After figuring this out, Fort was tempted to use his heat gun on everything, including on his lunch on the day there was a line for the microwave. Joking aside, he rates it a solid 8 out of 10, because of its overall quality but imperfect manual. "I would have loved to have given the PH-1400 ProHeat LCD Dial-In Heat Gun a 10," he explained, "I am confident it is built with the same quality as all my other Master Appliance tools."

The review

Eric Moore, a mechanic at DeMary Truck in Columbus, OH, is no stranger to retapping studs and dealing with broken bolts. He works in an industry where technicians put anti-seize on wheel studs. Thread repair is what you sign up for in the medium duty repair business.

Working on mainly Mitsubishi and UD trucks, Moore is used to having to break out his thread pitch gauges, bolt size guides and grade charts.

When he was sent a TriGage Combo

from Murray Tools, a tool that apparently can fulfill the functions of those three tools in one tool, he was intrigued.

It did not take long to put the tool to the test. "We used it during the replacement of exhaust manifold studs, when matching up the old ones to some we had in stock," Moore recalled. "The tool proved to be a very quick reference when doing this type of job."

Like most technicians, Moore does not read directions unless he absolutely has to. Moore reported that the tool was intuitive and that it did not come with directions, nor did he need them. "There was not a manual included, but there were quick references on the packaging," he noted. "Very easy to follow, and understand."

Along with the multi-tool's compact design, Moore commented on its ease of use.

"I felt that the inclusion of the three-


in-one tool made it very productive," he said. "I found the tools very easy to use."

Moore did have a suggestion for a future design improvement. "The only thought I had while using this tool was to maybe include the average torque specification reference for the bolt size/grade being referenced," he said.

"Some fasteners that we used this tool for reference on had no specific torque specification. In these specific applications, that would have been real handy."

Overall, Moore liked the tool.

"This combination tool was very effective, allowing in very few motions to measure the thread pitch, size the bolt, and also reference the grade being used," according to Moore. "I would rate this tool a solid nine out of 10 for the excellent and creative use in combining the three reference tools in one."





Great Stuff RoboReel Power Cord System

Power cord winds itself and keeps the user safe from electrical hazards in extreme situations.

he Great Stuff, Inc. RoboReel Power Cord System features a motorized rewind with no springs, and comes with a replaceable cord that won't corkscrew. Easily retract the cord with a power switch on the main unit or the button on the receptacle ball. RoboReel comes with 50' of 12-gauge cord and provides 360-degree rotation. It includes emergency power shutoff, overheat protection and a four-year, 4,000-wind warranty. Made of resins that are oil-, gas-, chemical- and UV-resistant, the RoboReel is ceiling mountable and portable.

The Review

Lou Fort, lead technician at Huntingburg, IN-based K.A.R.S. Inc., is used to using droplights for his extension cords, since these lights can be wound up pretty easily after all. However, sometimes he needs this droplight for one thing and he either has to walk to the far end of the shop for another droplight or roll out the dirty extension cord from the closet, do his work, and roll it up again to put it away.

When he received the RoboReel Power Cord System, he was curious to find out what it could do.

Fort said set-up for the portable unit was easy; all he had to do was mount it.

This unit can also remain unmounted for easy mobility around the shop. (Other versions of the RoboReel can be mounted on a ceiling.) The only "set-up" needed was to plug the unit in and pull out the cord to power it up.

"The RoboReel is the easiest, safest, extension cord I have ever used in my life," Fort said. "Having my extension cord on a reel keeps it from becoming a tangled up mess, which can take forever to straighten out."

Fort found it easy to operate. "I leave it plugged in 24/7. The RoboReel turns off the power to the cord when retracted, restoring power when extended 18" automatically," he explained. "The RoboReel's power retraction system has eliminated the need to walk the cord back to ensure it doesn't whip around, causing damage to anything or anyone.

"The RoboReel can also be retracted from its base, I found that feature to be quite handy more than a time or two."

This motorized extension cord is built to last, not only because of its warranty, but also the ease of fixing the unit for the years of use after its warranty is up. "The manual is worth hanging onto for proper maintenance," Fort noted. "It has instructions on replacing the cord or other parts when needed in the future. The manual also covers the units' features in more detail along with troubleshooting tips should you need some."

When asked if there were any features he would improve, Fort said there were "none."

However, he had no problem listing things he did like: "Let me start with its safety; if the cord gets cut it will shut the power off. Power to the extension cord receptacles, all three of them, can be turned on or off from either the base or receptacle end. Having built-in 'thermal' protection reduces the risk of fire. The extension cord can be retracted from either



in a self-leveling mounting system that can be attached to any ceiling beam or vertical beam.

the base or receptacle end. You can extend the cord to any length desired without having to over extend to find a latch like a spring-style reel cord. The cord base pivots a full 360 degrees, so no matter which way it's mounted, it maintains full functionality."

"The RoboReel Portable Power System is a game changer; I give the RoboReel a 10+," Fort said. "I used the RoboReel to power up battery chargers, heat guns, vacuum cleaners, worklights, inductive heater systems, etc. The RoboReel powered pretty much anything that needed power from an extension cord."

obby Blundell has been in the business for only six years - long enough to need a good box but not too long to be jaded when it comes to the business. His lighthearted nature can be seen in his box.

Blundell calls it "the entertainment center." His Snap-on KRL7972 Workcenter with a KRL7245 overhead has "everything you need to fight your boredom." The toolbox has a desktop gaming computer, Altec Lansing home theater stereo speakers, wireless keyboard and mouse, and a Samsung flatscreen HD TV. The entertainment center also includes a Playstation 3. Many of the techs at Sioux City Ford-Lincoln spend their lunches

playing video games at the box.

Is it a toolbox or an "entertainment box?"

"Everyone knows lunch is at Robby's box," Blundell says. "Myself and another tech here always joke about it being a landmark to visit when anyone travels to Sioux City."

Blundell aims to make his box his "own little environment." So he made other modifications for his own gratification. They include a gratuitous amount of lights: four white LED strips in the overhead, four blue LED strips under the stainless top, and two blue LED strips under the workcenter for an "underglow effect." He added two Blizzard oscillating fans to keep him cool during the summer. For charging his cell phone, he

> mounted to the side wall of the overhead a Rocketfish cell phone charger.

That is not to say Blundell is not a serious technician. The box has all the tools that an ASE certified technician needs at his age. The box and the service cart carry about \$10,000 of hand tools, \$1,500 in Ford-specific specialty tools, and \$4,000 in assorted electronic and pneumatic tools (impacts, drills, gauges for fuel pressure or engine compression, and more).

His favorite tool is his Power Probe III: "I have made a lot of money with that [tool]. If you do any electrical at all, check one out, they're awesome." But Blundell does not discount his hub grappler, because "it makes it fun to pull bearings apart. That thing has saved me countless hours and is well worth the money. The way it is designed is a little misleading. It doesn't work how you think a normal puller might, but it is very nice to have around."

Blundell boasts that his box is "an electronic guy's dream." For years he had a Snap-on 54" box, but he always dreamed about the box he has now. One day, daydreaming aloud, the Snap-on representative just happened to walk in trying to unload a new box. It was exactly the box that Blundell was dreaming of, so he traded in his old box (which was paid in full) for the one he has now. For some people, dreams do come true.

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
